



TAYLOR SCHILLING ON <mark>DEKALB AVENUE</mark> IN BROOKLYN

Actress **TAYLOR SCHILLING** knew what to expect the first time she visited New York City. As an 11-year-old, she had already binge-watched many of Woody Allen's New York films: *Annie Hall, Manhattan, Broadway Danny Rose.* "I didn't realize it, but I'd been preparing to visit the city for so long," she says. "And then I got here, and I thought, 'This is where I wanna be.'" Twenty years later, Schilling is being binge-watched on the Netflix show *Orange Is the New Black* (though, hopefully, not by 11-year-olds), which kicks off its fourth season June 17. In late 2015, Schilling migrated from Manhattan to a leafy neighborhood in Brooklyn filled with gorgeous 19th-century architecture.
