## Greenmarket Site Selection Guidelines

We operate Greenmarket in a wide variety of locations in New York City, on wide sidewalks to closed streets, private plazas, parking lots, even inside parks and transportation hubs.

The most desirable sites:

- are well known,
- are easily visible and accessible,
- are in a neighborhood of medium to high density,
- have significant existing foot traffic, and
- have parking for farmers' trucks.

Markets always do better when a friendly face is present from the neighborhood. Local sponsors, such as a block association, BID, church, community center, co-op, tenants association, or even an ad-hoc committee can be invaluable. It is especially helpful if the sponsor has a nearby office, apartment or storefront where materials could be stored (fliers, a table, etc), emergency phone calls made or received and toilet facilities made available to farmers. A dedicated individual, with the time, energy, and the ability to get things done, should represent the sponsoring group. The local sponsor will be depended on to circulate fliers in the immediate neighborhood.
